Resources

You could make gingerbread men puppets, or gingerbread men on sticks to support the children to be involved. These can all be made by the children.

Extension opportunities

You can also support gross motor development and spatial awareness by encouraging children to be the gingerbread men and run away then the children can count how many of their friends are left.

If you do not have any resources, you can simply help children to count with their fingers and this will help them to count down and understand that one has been taken away each time. Asking the children at the end of each verse how many are left will help to develop their problem solving skills as well as their number recognition and subtraction skills.

Home learning ideas

You can make number sacks for the home learning environment so parents can use these resources to extend the learning.
