Resources

You could make props with elephant cut outs stuck onto lollipop sticks and use these with the rhyme. You could also use wool or string to make a spider web and place the props into it as the elephants play on the spider's web.

Extension opportunities

You can simply encourage children to count with their fingers. This will help them to count up and understand that one has been added each time. Asking the children at the end of each verse how many elephants there are now will help to develop their number recognition and understanding of cardinality. You could ask five children to sit in a line and as each elephant goes to play on the spiders web one more could stand up to represent the total number.

Home learning ideas

Send a copy of the rhyme and the props home (or a copy that can be made at home).
