### **Extension opportunities**

As the children begin to learn their body parts and start to be able to count with you, you can extend this activity to children to support them to count their own body parts and start to understand that some parts come in pairs and that there are five fingers on each hand. This will support their understanding of counting in twos and fives much better as they progress through their learning and development journey.

Starting to count using their fingers will enable their counting and calculating skills to be developed from this early age.
