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

#### **Resources**

You may decide to use visual aids to support this rhyme to enable your visual and kinaesthetic learners to be supported.

You could make ant finger puppets, or ants on sticks to support the children to be involved. These can all be made by the children or you may choose to make ant masks for the children so they are then able to act out the rhyme themselves.

You may choose to use small world ant toys to help children to be able to act this out on their own or to aid with their counting. Setting up a rhyme sack will enable children to access this at any time.

### **Extension opportunities**

If you do not have any resources you can simply help children to count with their fingers and this will help them to count up and understand that each verse has one extra ant marching. Asking the children at the end of each verse how many there will be marching next time will help to develop their problem solving skills as well as their number recognition and addition skills.

## **Home learning ideas**

Children will enjoy singing this rhyme at home and use the puppet and props with their parents. You can use the resources you created in the nursery for the home rhyme sacks, but remember to put the words in the sack too, so parents and other family members can join in.

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
